


VISA	O-1A EXTRAORDINARY ABILITY INDIVIDUALS	L-1 INTRACOMPANY EXECUTIVE OR MANAGER TRANSFEREE
Description	Very valuable for those with a significant record of achievement in the sciences, education, business or athletics.	Great option for foreigners transferring from a qualifying entity abroad to work as executives or managers in the U.S.
Duration	Up to 3 years or duration of event. Unlimited one year extensions as long as fulfilling the requirements of the category.	Up to 3 years for initial petition for an established company. New office petition up to for 1 year with extensions. Two year renewals available for a maximum of 7 years.
Requirements	 Must show recognition and renown through at least 3 of following: Employment in essential capacity; Judge of work of others; Contributions of significance to field; Published material about applicant; Prizes/awards; Membership in prestigious organizations; and Significant publications. Advisory letter required	Must have sponsoring employer. U.S. employer must have qualifying relationship with employer abroad (affiliate, branch, subsidiary or parent). Both entities must continue to share common ownership and control and continue to operate. Must have been employed abroad full time as a manager or executive for qualifying employer for 1 of the least 3 years. New office must show secured commercial space to operate.
Spouse	Spouse can apply for O-3 status but might not work in this status.	Spouse can apply for L-2 status and employment authorization.






When it comes to Managers and Executives into the U.S., we have two main options: the L-1 visa intracompany transferees and the O-1 visa for people with "extraordinary ability" in business and sports. Below, we answer some of the most FAQ about these categories.

Can the applicant come to the U.S. on a visitor visa while waiting for the L-1 or O-1 visa to be processed?

It is possible to come to the U.S. on a visitor's visa (B visa) while the petition is being processed. However, you are highly limited on what you can do in the U.S. on a visitor's visa. A violation of the terms of the B visa, can jeopardize the chances of getting a work visa approved.

Working under a B visa is not permitted. The B visa allows you primarily to: attend business meetings, conventions or conferences, negotiate contracts, participate in short-term training, and settle an estate. The best approach is to work diligently with your attorney to complete your work visa filing.

Can the applicant travel abroad while the L-1 or O-1 extension is pending?

Yes. However, if the L-1 or O-1 status or visa expires while the person is abroad, they must remain abroad until the petition is approved and/or they have obtained a new visa. This is why it is important to begin the extension process six-months prior to the expiration of the current status. If travel abroad is needed, we recommend premium processing the extension filing.

How can those in L-1 or O-1 status apply for a green card?

L-1A and O-1A visa holders can utilize the EB-1 category to apply for a green card. This category was specifically developed for managers and executives and talented personnel.

To apply, the L-1A holder must have been a manager or executive abroad for at least one year in the three years prior to admission to the U.S.; the petitioning company must conduct regular business in the U.S. and another country; and the company must have been in active continues business in the U.S. for at least one year.

To apply, the O-1A holder must show that they have risen to the top of their field in the sciences, education, business or athletics. The petition must also demonstrate that the applicant will substantially benefit the U.S. prospectively because of his/her unique abilities enhance our country.

The EB-1 process avoids the lengthy and challenging PERM labor certification process. However, the standard of proof is also higher.
