Why Do I Need a Lawyer?



Florida law specifically allows for single or married Intended Parents, regardless of sexual orientation, to become parents through surrogacy. All parties to a surrogacy arrangement in Florida must enter into a Gestational Surrogacy Agreement, which outlines each party's rights and intentions throughout the journey. Following the birth of the child, an expedited hearing is held to affirm the Intended Parents' parental status.
